Elders need to have a get together meeting where they can listen to what our thoughts are and learn more about this industry, see what this industry involves.

> Our lives and our health, our dreaming and our knowledge is our culture. I wanted to write to the fracking inquiry because I'm interested in learning more about fracking and I'm afraid and upset because I'm worried about country and our future if fracking goes ahead.

> Water keeps us all alive. I've seen photos of where fracking has polluted water. I don't want that on my country.

>

> There are sacred sites that the landowners don't want to see destroyed. We need them to be left alone, culturally there is rainbow serpent on that land, in that land. Fracking could make that cultural land very angry.

> Killing the plants and animals from the poison chemicals they use to put into the earth – those animals rely on the earth to grow – it's beautiful. Seeing the land and mother nature like that, gives me a relaxing vibe.
